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## Terms for publishing

1. All submitted articles are considered for both, online and print publication, subject to a page limit of 20 pages, or unless otherwise stated by the author.
2. All submitted articles must be Open Access, with a relevant Creative Commons 4.0 license.
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5. The paper should represent unique, original and accurate information concerning the theme.
6. The submitted paper will be subject to a double blind peer-review by two independent experts, who reserve the decision to recommend the paper for the publication. Recommendation, and the subsequent publication, does not indicate endorsement of the author's viewpoints by the reviewers or the publication. Additionally, the right to correct the information provided in the paper is reserved by the editorial board.
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9. The paper should be submitted with consistent formatting, as mentioned in the formatting guidelines, with APA style referencing.
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## Guidelines for publication

The GRADE Journal welcomes papers, articles, dialogues, notes, book reviews, as well as commentary on topics and areas that are indicatively listed below:

## Guidelines for submission of intent

### *Conflict of Interest*

All submissions must include a 'Conflict of Interest' paragraph before the 'Acknowledgements', to indicate any potential or actual conflict of interest with other individuals or organisations that could inappropriately influence or be perceived to influence their research. In the event that the authors have nothing to declare, please mention: "No known conflict of interest could have influenced this research."

### *Abstract*

The abstract should in 100-150 words, outline the primary objectives and results of the research, and should be able to provide a clear understanding of the purpose of the paper. The abstract should be followed by a maximum of 5 keywords.

### *Author biography*

Author biographies should contain information about one or all the authors' educational background, updated professional information, field of research, and previously published papers, if any. The biographies are to be appended at the end of the document and should not exceed 150 words for each author.

## Editorial Process

### *Initial Vetting*

Submitted papers are vetted by the Editorial Board to ensure that they comply with the publishing ethics and requirements of the journal. If the paper is in violation of this, the intent for publication will be rejected by the Board. If the paper complies with the publishing ethics and requirements, the Board will proceed to review the congruency of the research with the scope of the journal.

### *Peer-Review*

Once the paper passes the initial vetting process, two independent experts are assigned for peer-review. In line with a double-blind review process, the authors' identities are not disclosed to the reviewers and vice versa. The comments made by the reviewers are kept confidential and anonymous. Reviewers may invite academic experts, with due intimation and consent of the Editorial Board, to check for and confirm the information provided in the paper.

### *Decision and Review*

All the submissions, post the double-blind review, are submitted to the Editorial Board with the following decisions:

- **Accepted after Minor Revisions:** The paper is accepted in principle, and reviewer comments are shared with the author(s), upon incorporation of which, the paper is accepted for publication.
- **Reconsider after Major Revisions:** The paper is accepted subject to the revisions made by the author(s) once the reviewer comments are shared. Author(s) are given a timeline within which the major revisions in the paper are to be made, and resubmitted for review. Reconsideration after major revisions is done only once, and the decision for acceptance or rejection is only made after the revised paper is submitted.
- **Reject and Encourage Resubmission:** The paper is rejected, however, reviewer comments are shared with the author(s). Author(s) are encouraged to revisit the study or research, and resubmit after identified gaps in the research are filled.
- **Rejected:** If the research has any fundamental or principle flaws, the paper is rejected and reviewer comments are not shared with the author.

All reviewer comments should be responded to in a point-by-point fashion. Where the authors disagree with a reviewer, they must provide a clear response.

### *Production and Publication*

Once accepted, the paper undergoes professional copy-editing, English editing, proofreading, final corrections, pagination, and, publication on the [www.gradejournal.com](http://www.gradejournal.com) website.

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
